It is October 2015. An email comes through: 'International Secondment opportunities – Denmark'.

A 3 months transfer to Mazars Copenhagen. I have never been out of South Africa and only got my passport a week ago. I am single with nothing stopping me from going, why not try it? I quickly read through the email and make

- Hygge The untranslatable Danish word which loosely describes
 the feeling of togetherness and comfort Danes create when
 visiting with each other, or even when alone. We eat lunch
 together every day, we have cake at least once a week and
 celebrate every achievement of an employee together. It's like a
 working family.
 - Work The working environment is great. There is mutual respect and everyone knows their role in the Mazars partnership. The Mazarians are hardworking and put in the hours required to meet the deadlines which is a necessary byproduct of our profession. However, there is no negative atmosphere which you normally get around an office where people have been working more than required. It is a job that needs doing and so it gets done.

Clients – I got exposed to such a varied portfolio of clients. From advertising agencies to an international manufacturing group and clients in the IT sector. I got to work on clients as subsidiaries, clients working through shared service centers and a group consolidation. The experience gained from these has been fantastic. It has broadened my way of thinking by hearing how these companies measure and evaluate their performance.

Language – The one obstacle that took a little bit of effort getting over. Danish is the primary language communication occurs in. Both verbal and written. All working papers are in Danish so Google Translate became my friend. It is not an obstacle that can't be overcome but it takes a bit of time.
